They've all made the journey worthwhile.

So, as I move through this particular Natal Day, I give thanks to the God who names us and claims us, and charts our journeys for us. I also give thanks for the Holy Spirit which nourishes us along the way and recalibrates the course when we lose it. I've learned never to take their presence in my life for granted – it is the gift to end all gifts!
