From Pastor Kent's Desk

I'm listening to Christmas music as I write this. I vowed I'd wait until after Thanksgiving before I did, but how can you write about Christmas without Christmas music playing in the background? We've got more than 200 Christmas recordings on CD's and vinyl in our collection. Some go back to the 1960's but still sound great! Being musical purists, the collection is divided into Advent, Christ-

mas, and Epiphany recordings. We're heavy on English cathedral choirs – there's nothing like the boy choir sound to make the season bright!

More than any other season of the church year, music plays an integral role in the celebration of the Advent/Christmas/Epiphany cycle. The carols, the hymns, the cantatas tug at our hearts and send them soaring Each of us has our favorites, and the season wouldn't be complete if we didn't hear our "special music." It reminds us of



Christmas' past, when we were children and our families were gathered all around the tree early on Christmas morning. We couldn't wait to open our gifts, and before we knew it, the wrapping paper was strewn all over the living room floor and we were busily playing with or assembling our "big gifts," as Christmas music played in the background.

More than likely, we'd been at the Christmas Eve Candlelight Service at church the night before. It was an opportunity to sing favorite carols and hear glorious anthems from the choir. When you were young, you snuggled-in next to your folks and dozed-off while the minister preached the obligatory Christmas Eve Sermon. It was the only other time during the year that the church was packed, and the minister had to make a good impression on the visitors! (I know that from experience!)

Our memories are wrapped-up in the music, and when I hear it, they come rushing back again. I know the Christ Child is the "reason for the season," but it is much more complicated than that. It becomes even more so with age. But lest we dwell only in the past, let's live fully into this season.



As we gather at Bethany for the Advent/Christmas/Epiphany cycle of 2019, let's make new memories. The Christ Child *is* the reason for the season – we must never forget that! Our hearts and minds are renewed each time he comes, and our lives take on new meaning for the coming year. So, here's to the music of the spheres as the angels join in chorus once again to announce the royal birth. The Babe of Bethlehem has come again to a waiting world!

Christmas Joy Offering Helps Retired Minister Live with Dignity & Joy

Grocery shopping had become an anxiety-filled experience for the Rev. Gloria Casasus-Urrutia. Ten years after her 2006 retirement as organist at her church, Porta Coeliin San German, Puerto Rico, she found her self thrust into severe financial hardship. "I had to write down the price of each item and add everything up to make sure I had the money."

I bet there are probably people in this room who know what that feels like, and it's notgood.

Her situation forced her to move four times over two years, and she struggled to find a safe and affordable place to live. Then, to make matters even worse, Hurricane Maria struck.

As we've all heard, much of Puerto Rico was devastated, and it isn't hard to believe that Gloria was beset by a bevy of mental anguish and physical problems. "I had a panic attack, I had bronchitis, my arm was dislocated, and as if that wasn't enough, my puppy had to be hospitalized for several days."

But as a woman of faith, she was never in total despair. "I suffered a deep depression, but there was something that was not affected — my faith and trust in the God of love and mercy that we preach so much." She prayed for people who suffered severe setbacks from the storm and gave thanks for the meager provisions she had.

But soon, God opened a door. Isn't that so often the way? Gloria became aware that help might be available when she contacted the church's Board of Pensions seeking an income certification letter so she could apply for government benefits. Her pension was small because she entered ministry later in life and served small congregations with limited financial resources. Maria Perry, a Board service specialist, took note of Gloria's extremely modest income and urged her to apply to the Assistance Program.

"I saw light at the end of the tunnel," Gloria said. Her life was about to become less of a struggle thanks to a grant from the Assistance Program of the Board of Pensions. The Assistance Program is supported by gifts from congregations, just like ours, to the Christmas Joy Offering.

Gloria says her life "has taken on a new turn." The grant enabled her to get her car fixed, and her grocery shopping is no longer such a worr isome chore.

Gloria is so grateful for the gifts to the Christmas Joy Offering and for the Assistance Program of the Board of Pensions they support. Gloria especially wants her Presbyterian family to know that she faithfully places her tithe in her congregation's offering plate to share the blessings that she received. She said the generosity of Presbyterians and the work of the Board of Pensions bears witness to the care of the "Good Shepherd."


2019 Advent Study

We will be exploring Advent in new and exciting way during Advent 2019. Our guide will be a new book by author, professor, and renown biblical scholar, Amy-Jill Levine. The title of the study is *Light of the World: A Beginner's Guide to Advent.* Dr. Levine is the University Professor of New Testament and Jewish Studies at Vanderbilt Divinity School.

In the study, we will be focusing on the biblical texts surrounding the story of the birth of Jesus. We'll join Dr. Levine as she traces the Christmas narrative through the stories of Zechariah and Elizabeth, Mary, the journey to Bethlehem, and the visit from the Magi. These stories open conversations around connections of the

Gospel stories to the Old Testament, the role of women in the first-century Jewish culture, the importance of Mary's visitation, and the revolutionary implications of Mary's Magnificat, the census and the stable, and the star of Bethlehem and the flight to Egypt.

Our study will begin on Wednesday morning, November 27, at 10am in Memorial Parlor. Copies of the book will be available in the Narthex, or from Rev. Holmes. Plan on joining us for what will be an intellectually stimulating and spiritually nurturing experience! It will be a wonderful addition to your Advent preparations.






Thank You from Pack 4
