

### When Will We Re-Open????

Good question! The quick answer is: We don't know. At its last Session Meeting, the Session decided to re-open the Church when the State moves to Green on the Covid-19 Scale. We'll continue practicing "social-distancing" for a while, wear masks, elbow-bump, and keep our mouths shut (no hymn singing). To a large degree, the age of our congregation dictates our next moves. We trend to the higher end of the age spectrum, so our safeguards are more "conservative" when compared to younger-trending congregations. That said, it might be late-August, early-September before it is safe to return to the Sanctuary. We'll keep you informed as we learn more information from the State Department of Health.

We'll continue recording "on-line" worship through the summer months. From your comments, our efforts seem to be panning-out OK. It's not perfect, but it gives the church an opportunity to be a



presence in your lives as we continue our social distancing. All members should have received the summer bulletin in the mail; it is also available on our website on Sunday mornings.

Memorial Day has come and gone, and the 4<sup>th</sup> of July is the next "landmark" on our calendars. The days are warmer, and the evenings have grown longer as we continue our relentless movement toward summer.

For most of us, vacations will not be happening this summer. "Stay-cations" will be the order of the day, with long-distance trips put on hiatus until the fall, at least. We will have to be satisfied with sitting on our porches watching the flowers bloom and the grass grow. If nothing else, we'll save a lot of money on fuel!

I think this will be the first time in my life that I haven't gone on an extended vacation in the summer. My folks always took me on a "road trip" every year. We traveled north, south, and east.
