From Pastor Kent's Desk



Here it is March 1st already! The wind is blowing outside – a good day for kite flying. (Maybe a little too strong!) Growing up, I always flew kites every spring. Kite flying is an exacting sport – the ratio of tail to kite is of utmost importance, and if you get it wrong, you never get off the ground! I ran miles trying to get kites up into the air, until some wise adult showed me how to do it: you get a good long string lead, have someone hold the kite, get a running start, release it, and up it goes! Less exercise, but much better results! It was a blast!

Don't see many kids flying kites anymore. Kind of a lost art akin to Yo-Yo's. I still remember the contests we had at school every year, spon-

sored by the Duncan Yo-Yo Company. In my prime, I had a pretty good catalogue of tricks. I never won any contests, but I didn't embarrass myself in the school yard, either! The contests were pretty cut-throat as I remember, but fun none-the-less!

Writing this makes me feel ancient! But there was a simplicity and grace to both kites and Yo-Yo's. Both were art forms, actually! Neither required any special technical electronic devices or expensive games. And they could easily be done face-to-face with a group of friends or by yourself. Radically different from

the "semi-professional" traveling teams that the kids are involved in today. I don't ever remember being scouted by a college for my kite flying ability when I was in junior high!

Where am I going with all of this? Simply this: There are times when we make following Jesus an academic pursuit or a conundrum that evades solving. In reality, Jesus speaks, we listen. Jesus calls, we follow. It's just that simple. Too often, though, we go down rabbit trails in search of the "real Jesus" when he's right there in front of us, smiling and engaging with us at every turn. Jesus wants to be in relationship with us. Jesus wants us to embrace the Good News of the Gospel with every fiber of our



being. Going down rabbit trails in search of Jesus can only end in frustration and heartache. It is in the light of day, when we "re-order" and "re-wire" our hearts and minds, that we see the real Jesus: God's Son, Our Savior.

Use this Season of Lent to spend time in prayer and contemplation, enabling God to cut through all the noise and the gamesmanship which is so prevalent in today's culture. It is in the simplicity of the silence that we hear God speaking to us personally, inviting us to the journey and to the peace which comes when we follow Jesus on his way to Jerusalem. We don't need anything special for the journey – only a good pair of walking shoes, and a willingness to leave all of the other "stuff" behind. When we do, we see our way clear to follow the Christ wherever he leads! It's as easy as flying a kite!

Because We Are the Church, Together



Life during COVID has been challenging. That feels like an understatement, right? At times, we have all felt disconnected, confined. Missing family, missing friends. Lonely. Worried about the groceries holding out. Unsure of what the future may hold. Imagine feeling all of those things but living in a place or in a situation that was already challenging each and every day without the added pressure of the pandemic. A place where access to food is day to day. Access to vital health care is questionable. Finding clean water is a daily struggle. A place where you are denied racial justice or plagued with outright violence and oppression.

But one thing remains steadfast and true: We are the Church, together, no matter where we are, and the Church belongs with those struggling for justice, righteousness and **peace- for life.**

Because food is life ... gifts to OGHS are helping the people of Pine Ridge Indian Reservation in South Dakota through a partnership with Owe Aku — a grassroots, nonprofit organization that puts people in charge of their own food supply, nutrition, health and well-being by reclaiming ancestral wisdom and teaching Lakota history and culture. The Pine Ridge Reservation is a food desert, located in the county with the lowest per capita income in the nation. The pandemic has dramatically amplified the desperate need for food security.

Because water is life ... gifts to OGHS are helping the families of Capirendita in a remote area of Bolivia face a more hopeful future by building infrastructure to address the communities' critical water shortage. Their goal is to create 500 meters of pipes to transport safe well water to those in need. OGHS gifts will also support the distribution of plastic containers to collect and save rainwater.

Because survivors are key to shaping lives focused on justice for all ... gifts to OGHS are helping Black Women's Blueprint in its mission to take action on social justice issues and to deliver educational resources and support services to women, including those who have suffered sexual and other forms of abuse. Their work seeks to address the unique struggles of Black women and girls within the context of the larger racial justice concerns. They're not just addressing issues of trauma but they're also providing things like food and housing assistance that people need in order to be whole.

The Special Offerings of the PC(USA), including OGHS, offer the whole Church a way to embody Matthew 25 through the Spirit-inspired stories and gifts that place us in service and partnership with those who have least. Our gifts directly support people experiencing hunger, homelessness, thirst, imprisonment, sickness



and deprivation, as well as welcoming the stranger. OGHS is the largest way that Presbyterians come together in mission and ministry with those whom we see are in need.
